Student Behavior Policies

Attendance and Punctuality

- AIS students are punctual and maintain solid attendance.
- Please call the school before 7:25 am on the day of an absence.
- Please provide a medical certificate and letter for absences of 3 or more days.





Student Behavior Policies

Students must stay on campus

- Please do NOT set appointments with doctors, dentists, etc. during school hours.
- Students are NOT permitted to leave the school grounds without the Principal's permission.





Student Behavior Policies

Student Early Drop off and Late Pick Up

- AIS cannot provide supervision before 7 am (or after 4 pm).
- If the fetcher is not present during pick-up time, children will be supervised by the After School Care teacher/s (ASC).

Student Behavior Policies

Student Attire

School Uniform

- Red polo shirt, beige pants/shorts/skorts, black shoes (with flat sole)
- Skorts/skirts must reach the knee-top; socks must reach the knee-bottom
- If a HS student is out of uniform, we will provide a new one (charged to your account).









Student Behavior Policies

Student Attire

- Friday is 'School Spirit Day'.
- During PE day, students must come in their proper AIS uniform (for HS).





Student Behavior Policies

Student Attire

The following are not allowed at school:

- Hair coloring or any attention-catching hairstyle
- Jewelry, make-up, nail-polish, accessories, etc.
- Hair reaching the ears, eyebrows or collar (for boys)





Student Behavior Policies

Cellphone and Gadgets

- Electronic devices may be used for academic purposes ONLY.
- Inappropriate use of gadgets will result in confiscation.
- Grades 1-3 students are NOT encouraged to bring phones to school (to prevent loss).

Class Parties and Celebrations

- Student birthday parties are NOT allowed at AIS.
- Please have parties off campus during nonschool hours.
- Parents may organize a healthy birthday lunch with the advisory teacher.

Minor Offences

- Tardy (<5min)
- Uniform violation
- Sleeping at school
- Junk food at school
- Disruption of lesson
- Running in hallway

- Unprepared for lesson
- Toys/electronics at school
- Rude language
- Not speaking English
- Out of class without a hall pass



Student Behavior Policies

Major Offences

- Hazing
- Joining fraternities
- Fighting with threatening, bullying, etc.
- Cheating, copying, plagiarizing etc.
- Setting off a false fire alarm
- Willfully damaging school property
- Cutting class
- Bringing prohibited items to school



Student Behavior Policies

Demerits

- Demerits are not issued in grades 1-4
- In Grades 5-12, students receive one demerit for each minor offence





Student Behavior Policies

Violations and Consequences

- MS students detention after 10 demerits
- HS students detention after 4 demerits
- HS students suspension after 5 detentions
- Parents are notified of sanctions through a letter and by phone.





Student Behavior Policies

Academic Dishonesty

Academic dishonesty is when a student (or a parent) attempts to gain unfair advantage and/or deceive the teacher. It includes cheating, lying, plagiarism, missing deadlines, etc.





Student Behavior Policies

Suspensions

For a suspension/serious offence, we will set up:

- meeting with the parent/guardian to discuss strategies, agreements, terms and conditions
- meeting with the discipline committee if needed (discipline office, head teacher, and AIS Admin)
- hearing committee if necessary (EAC Dean, AIS Admin, AIS Head Teacher and a PTA representative)
